ROCK OUT 2020 COMPETITION

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

By entering the Rock Out 2020 competition, it will be assumed that you have read these terms and conditions and that you accept them for and on behalf of your school.

Who may Enter

1. The Rock Out 2020 competition is open to any school (primary, secondary or all-through schools) **located in England only** (including Isle of Wight, Channel Islands and the Isle of Man) who has either an active school subscription or an active school trial to Times Tables Rock Stars on trockstars.com.
2. If your school does not have an active school subscription, you are welcome to request a 4 week free trial for your school to gain access to Times Tables Rock Stars and participate in the Rock Out 2020 competition by going to trockstars.com/page/trials3.
3. The Rock Out 2020 competition is not open to users of Times Tables Rock Stars on family or tutor accounts.
4. Only bona fide schools are eligible to compete in the Rock Out 2020 competition. It is not open to home schools or non-school organisations.
5. Only bona fide students are eligible to compete in the Rock Out 2020 competition. Staff are not allowed to participate.
6. Any foul play or cheating will not be tolerated and will result in a permanent exclusion from the Rock Out 2020 competition. Maths Circle's judgement on this issue will be final.

How and When to Enter

1. To enter your school in the Rock Out 2020 Competition, please login to your Times Tables Rock Stars account and head to **Tournaments > MWE Rock Out 2020**. Please accept the invitation and choose the Maths Classes that you would like to participate in the competition. Please note that Pastoral Classes cannot participate in Rock Out 2020, only Maths Classes can participate.
2. There is no limit on the number of Maths Classes that can enter the Rock Out 2020 competition. There is no limit on the number of pupils within each Maths Class but there needs to be a minimum of 5 pupils in each class.
3. Average scores are taken on a per pupil (who has played during the Competition Period) basis to ensure a fair and even competition, as class sizes and school populations will differ.
4. This competition **will run from 07:30 (GMT) until 19:30 (GMT) each day from and including 9 November 2020 until and including 14 November 2020** (the "Competition Period").
5. **Only answers given between the hours of 07:30 (GMT) to 19:30 (GMT) each day within the Competition Period will count towards the competition. Answers given before 07:30 (GMT) or after 19:30 (GMT) will NOT count towards the competition.**
6. The winners of the competition are the **pupils, Maths Classes and schools with the highest number of correct answers given on average per pupil who has played on Times Tables Rock Stars during the Rock Out 2020 Competition Period.**
7. Answers given correctly by pupils on *any* game mode within Times Tables Rock Stars count towards the total scores (i.e. to include questions answered in Garage, Studio, Arena, Festival and Soundcheck game modes). This ensures that pupils of all ages and levels can take part.
8. Any correct answers given by pupils before or after the competition start and end times will not be counted.
9. There is no entry fee for the Rock Out 2020 Competition.

The Winners and the Prizes

1. The top 6 maths classes (remember: it's the average per pupil score that this is based on) will win Amazon vouchers for their school (£100 for the winning maths class, £90 for the second place maths class, £80 for the third place maths class, £70 for the fourth place maths class, £60 for the fifth place maths class and £50 for the sixth place maths class).

2. Downloadable certificates will be available for participating schools to download and print themselves for the winners that fall within the following categories:
 - i. top 3 overall schools – the top 3 Schools with the highest number of correct answers given on average per pupil who played during the Rock Out 2020 Competition Period;
 - ii. top 3 overall classes - top 3 Maths Classes with the highest number of correct answers given on average per pupil who played during the Rock Out 2020 Competition Period (as stated above, the average will be calculated by dividing by 5 if fewer than 5 pupils from the class play);
 - iii. top 3 pupils overall - top 3 pupils with the highest number of correct answers given overall during the Rock Out 2020 Competition Period;
 - iv. top 3 classes within each school – top 3 classes with the highest number of correct answers given at each school during the Rock Out 2020 Competition Period (as stated above, the average will be calculated by dividing by 5 if fewer than 5 pupils from the class play); and
 - v. top 3 performing pupils within each class & school - top 3 pupils with the highest number of correct answers given at each school during the Rock Out 2020 Competition Period.
3. All prizes are non-exchangeable, non-transferrable and no cash alternative is offered.
4. Maths Circle reserves the right to alter the prizes, or to not select any winners at all.
5. Maths Circle reserves the right to refuse entry or to refuse to award a prize to anyone in breach of these Terms and Conditions or against the spirit of the Terms and Conditions.
6. Maths Circle's decision shall be final, no correspondence regarding the results will be entered into.
7. In the event of an exact tie, Maths Circle will check the average scores to 3 decimal places to determine the winning pupil(s), Maths Class(es) and/or School(s). Maths Circle's decision shall be final.
